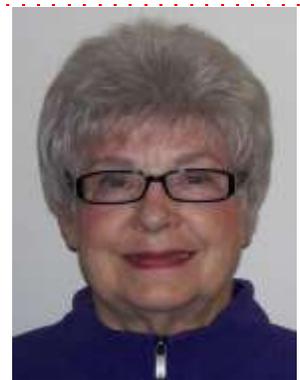

## Expecting a Package? So are Scammers!

Expecting packages shipped to your home this holiday season? You're not the only one... scammers are, too.

We've learned of a phony "delivery failure notification" email making the rounds. It looks like it's from the U.S. Postal Service — but it's not. The email says you missed a delivery. But, it says, if you print the attached form and take it to your local post office, you can pick up your package and avoid penalties. The message might also include a link for more details.



Fraudulent emails seemingly from FedEx or UPS state that a package that could not be delivered. The attachment in the email may contain a virus. Please do not open the attachment and delete the email immediately.

USPS, FedEx or UPS not send unsolicited emails to customers. **Delete them and do not open!**



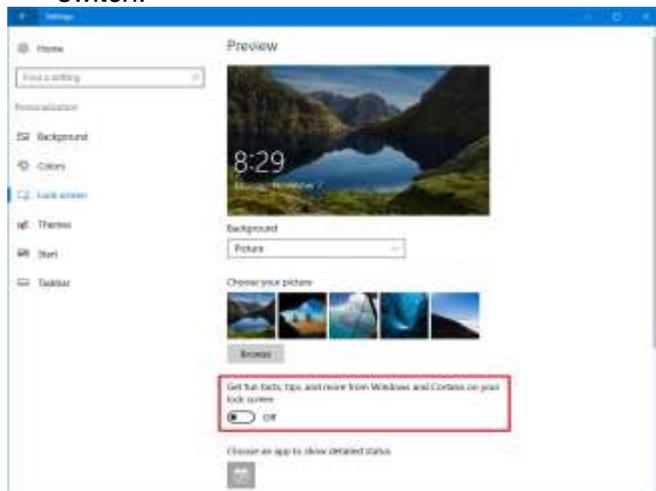
# How to Remove Windows 10 Built-in Ads

Windows 10 allows you to remove most of the nagging ads, but there is not a master switch. You actually need to hunt down the options, which can be troublesome when they're scattered around, and the operating system doesn't even call them ads. Fortunately, you can use these steps to get rid of ads on your computer.

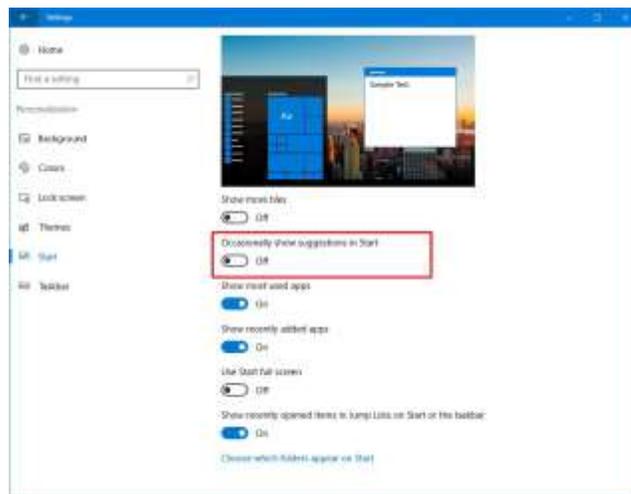
To remove ads from the Lock screen:

1. Click on Start button.
2. Open Settings (The gear icon).
3. Click on Personalization.
4. Click on Lock screen.
5. In the Background drop-down menu, select Picture or Slideshow.
6. Turn off the "Get fun facts, tips, and more from Windows and Cortana on your lock screen toggle switch."



To remove ads from Start menu, do the following:

1. Open Settings
2. Click on Personalization.
3. Click on Start.
4. Turn off the "Occasionally show suggestions in Start in Start toggle switch."
